In accordance with MCU General Provisions for Study, all undergraduate students must pass the requirements for Service-Learning, English Proficiency, Information Technology Proficiency, Chinese Proficiency, Sports Ability, and Basic Professional Skills in order to graduate. Students of Leisure and Recreation Administration Department are required to pass the professional basic ability test during their study at MCU; the items and standards are as follows:(1)Professional ability in Leisure and Recreation Administration: Complete a graduation thesis as a team.(2)Theory application and practical ability: Complete 400 hours of internship on and off campus, submit a reflection report, and pass the evaluation of the employer and the Department.(3)Leisure and Recreation project planning ability: Acquire at least one professional certificate in leisure and recreation field, such as certification for CPR, recreational equipment manager, canoeing, lifeguard and first-aid, fitness instructor issued by any sports association, YMCA international fitness instructor, coach or referee issued by any sports association, paint ball coach, archery instructor or judge, tourist guide license (Chinese, foreign language), tourist leader license (Chinese, foreign language), creative activities planning professional certificate, Level C technician for Chinese culinary arts, Level C technician for western culinary arts, Level C technician for catering and tourism service, Level C technician for drink mixing, professional talent certificate in exhibition services, relevant certificates issued by governmental organization or NPO, or other relevant certificates recognized by the department.(4)Complete design and implementation of a leisure and recreation team project, submit activity plan and achievement report and pass the department review; or pass Leisure and Recreation Programming course.</p> <p>2. The minimum credits for graduation is 128 credits, including 28 university required course credits (including 12 general education credits), 35 school required course credits, 12 school elective courses credits, 27 department required credits and 26 department elective credits.</p> <p>3. Up to 4 credits of the total credits earned for Physical Education courses will be recognized. Additional course credits earned in General Education, teacher education program or courses offered by other departments cannot be counted in the total number of credits required for obtaining a Bachelor's degree.</p> <p>4. Students have to earn at least 12 General Education credits before graduation, which should include at least one course each from Humanities, Social Sciences, and Natural Sciences. These categories are sub-divided into core and extended courses, and at least one 2-credit course from each subdivision under each category must be completed to qualify for graduation.</p> <p>5. Students in each department should earn at least 26 elective credits, in principle, all within their own department. If other department's courses are approved by the department chair, up to 15 credits of such electives may be counted toward graduation credits. Students can retake economics (I), accounting (I) and other required courses with the same name from other department upon approval by the department chair. This practice can be applied to students who entered the university prior to the 2014-15 academic year.6. This course outline and the cancelation of prerequisite requirements may be applied to all students admitted prior to 2014-15 AY.</p>
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
